

ANNOUNCEMENT – PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL MEETINGS

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) will conduct a Public Informational Meeting concerning the proposed Major Intersection Improvements on Route 10/US 202 (Salmon Brook Street) at Route 20/189 (North Granby Road/East Granby Road) and at Route 189 (Hartford Avenue) on Wednesday March 16, 2016 at 7:00 PM at the Granby Senior Center.

The project is identified as Prospective State Project No. 55-TMP1.

The purpose of this project is to reduce delays and queue lengths during peak travel periods within Granby Center by widening portions of Salmon Brook Street, North Granby/East Granby Road and Hartford Avenue for additional auxiliary lanes. In addition, operational deficiencies will be addressed by a minor realignment of North Granby Road to improve turning capabilities for eastbound left-turning and through vehicles.

This project will also improve pedestrian accommodations by addressing gaps in the existing sidewalk system and by providing new sidewalks along the south side of Granby Road to Bank Street.

Property impacts associated with these improvements include 9 partial property acquisitions.

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) will conduct a Public Informational Meeting concerning the proposed Intersection Improvements on Route 10/US 202 (Salmon Brook Street) at East Street and Notch Road on Wednesday March 23, 2016 at 7:00 PM at the Granby Senior Center.

The project is identified as Prospective State Project No. 55-TMP2.

The purpose of this project is to address safety concerns, which will be addressed by the construction of a roundabout. The roundabout will eliminate the current crash patterns at this location and will reduce vehicular speeds on Salmon Brook Street. The proposed changes will improve the intersection of Notch Road at Quarry Road to address operational needs of larger vehicles.

Property impacts associated with these improvements include 3 partial property acquisitions.
