As you may recall, the Town of Granby annually produced a total of three program guides that were mailed to all Granby homes in the fall, spring, and summer. 

Drug Take-Back

National Prescription Drug Take-Back events are held in the Spring and Fall at the Granby Police Department. Drop off your old/unused prescription drugs for safe destruction.



Hazardous Waste Collection

The Town of Granby, in collaboration with our surrounding communities, holds three household hazardous waste collections a year. A list of accepted items is posted on the Public Works page of the town's website. In addition, you can bring up to 2 copy paper size boxes of documents to be shredded at the event. Identification showing proof of residency is required.

Transfer Station

The current hours of the Granby Transfer Station are Saturdays 8 AM to 3 PM, and Wednesdays 8 AM to noon. Wednesday hours will end for the winter season effective January 1, 2026. Charges will apply to nonrecyclable items. Payment can be made via cash or check. Please check the website or call DPW with any questions.

Snow Removal + Mailbox Repair

The DPW works diligently to keep roads safe for travel during winter storms. Town ordinance prohibits parking any vehicle on a town road from the start of a storm until 12 hours after the storm has ended.

Town ordinance states the Town will repair a mailbox damaged from direct contact with the plow. Mailboxes damaged by snow are not eligible for repair. If you feel your mailbox was hit by the plow, contact the DPW within 24 hours to report the damage.

Sand for Winter Weather

Sand mixed with salt is available at 166 Salmon Brook Street (the Granby Animal Shelter), opposite McLean Game Refuge. Residents of Granby may take one 5-gallon bucket at a time.

Extra Trash

Extra trash alongside a barrel will not be picked up unless it is a town authorized bag. Bags are \$2 each and can be purchased at the DPW or the transfer station during hours of operation.




ELDERLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED TAX RELIEF PROGRAM

- Program is open from February 15 until May 15 2026 (for the 2025 Grand List).
- Program is open to Granby homeowners who reside in Granby as their permanent domicile, are 65 years (as of December 31, 2025), who meet specific income requirements, and who do not receive this benefit from another town or state.
- All income and/or Income Tax information for 2025 are required.

BOARD OF ASSESSMENT APPEALS

- Applications will be filed between February 1, 2026 and February 20, 2026.
- The appeal hearings are for real estate, personal property and motor vehicles on the 10/01/2025 Grand List.
- Applications will be available online or in the Assessor's Office .
- Hearings will be held in March 2026.

GRAND LIST TIMEFRAMES

- The 2025 Grand List covers the timeframe of October 1, 2025 until September 30, 2026.
- If you dispose of a motor vehicle, on or after October 1, 2025, please notify the Assessor's Office; all documentation must include the date of disposition and the VIN.

VOTING IN GRANBY

The Registrars of Voters work year-round to maintain the Granby voter list and oversee elections and local referendums, including the annual budget vote in April.

Your right to vote is central to our Democracy. You can pick up a voter registration form at our office in Town Hall any Wednesday, from 9 am to 4 pm, at the Town Clerk's office or Granby library during their regular hours. You can email our office and we will mail you a registration form. It's also easy to fill out online at the Secretary of State's website: portal.ct.gov/sots

Absentee Ballot applications can be completed online at the Secretary of State's website, or picked up at the Town Clerk's office during their regular business hours.

UPCOMING OPPORTUNITIES TO PARTICIPATE

- Early Voting for the 2025 municipal election ends on November 2 at Town Hall
- Election Day is November 4, 6 am-8 pm at the High School Community Gym
- Town Committee caucuses are in early January for party members
- Town Committee delegates to conventions are chosen in March
- The annual budget referendum is in late April
- State conventions are held in May
- Primaries for major parties, if needed, are in August

HOW TO VOLUNTEER

COLLECTOR OF REVENUE

REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES

The second installment of Real Estate and Personal Property taxes is coming due soon. The due date is January 1, 2026 but the last day to pay without penalty is February 2, 2026. Payments made after this date are subject to interest at a rate of 1.5% per month (18% annually). The tax office does not do a separate mailing for second installments. Please refer to the coupon from the bill sent in June 2025 or go online to www.granby-ct.gov to look up your bill.

Supplemental Motor Vehicle Tax Bills will be mailed in December and will come due on January 1, 2026. These bills are for cars **newly registered** after October 1 2024, and for any vehicles inadvertently left off the summer billing cycle. Taxpayers will have until February 2, 2026 to pay without interest or penalty.

ONLINE BUILDING PERMIT SYSTEM

The Building Department has launched an online building permit system! Residents and contractors can now submit online using City Squared and track the status of a submitted permit. The link to City Squared is on the Building Department's webpage: www.granby-ct.gov/169/Building-Zoning-Enforcement.

If you have not used City Squared previously, you will need to register first in order to complete an online application. Once you open the City Squared home page, the registration option is found in the upper right-hand corner. If submitting a building permit online, you will have the option to pay by credit card. Please note that there is a convenience fee charged. If you prefer to pay by cash or check, payment can still be submitted directly to the Building Department.

While the online system has been launched, the Building Department will continue to accept hard copies of building permit applications. The application form is posted on the Building Department webpage and can be printed, completed, and submitted by mail or dropped off in person. The application form is also available in the Building Department in Town Hall.




