


Population Since 2000



Granby's population increased from 10,356 people in 2000 to 11,249 people in 2023, or 8.6%. During the same period, the Capitol Region's population increased by 5.6% and Connecticut's population by 6.1%.


Population by Age



Granby has the highest share of residents aged 60 and over (29%) compared to the Capitol Region (23%) and Connecticut (24%).



Median Household Income




Granby's median household income is \$116,000. This is \$27,833 higher than in the Capitol Region and \$25,810 higher than in Connecticut.

School Enrollment



In the past 20 years, the 2024-2025 school year had the fewest students enrolled, with 1,719 students, down from a peak of 2,318 students in the 2007-2008 school year.
